Meeting in the Age of Pandemics

As such, it was always the wisest and safest approach to organize societies such that they are often restricted by external legal requirements and their own design of bylaws to having regular in-person meetings. This new paradigm means that the traditional face-to-face meeting may be at times undesirable or even impractical, which will profoundly affect the world of parliamentarians. This workshop explores the changes that should be implemented in the governing documents to achieve the dual goals of complying with legal requirements safely and pursuing flourishing societies. Further, techniques will be re-envisioned for effective presiding, handling agendas, and managing debates within these dispersed organizations. Participants will come away with an understanding of the steps necessary to protect their organizations in the new world paradigm.





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
